


## Fancy's Second Chance!

It all started on October 10, 2018 when an Officer with the Warren City Police Department responded to the call of a dog that had been hit by a car. Upon arrival, it was apparent that the dog had been injured and required immediate veterinary care. That's when Brier Rose first arrived at Town & Country Veterinary Hospital and began her year-long journey to recovery and rehoming, all while touching the lives of so many people along her way.

Shortly after her arrival, Brier Rose, also known as Brier for short, received surgery to repair her fractured left front leg from the



generous staff at Town & Country. She remained in their care until she was transferred to Animal Welfare League on November 13, 2018. The staff at AWL had heard such wonderful things about Brier that everyone couldn't wait to meet her!



Unfortunately, Brier had difficulties healing from her surgery and eventually lead to a full leg amputation in December of 2018. While recovering from the amputation, Brier began to thrive in her new life. She was happy, sweet, and didn't mind a bit that she had only three legs. Brier was finally ready for adoption! In February 2019, she took the exciting walk to the adoption floor. Brier couldn't wait for a family of her own to love her endlessly. Staff knew that like all dogs that walk through our doors, Brier deserved a second chance. After all this time, Brier had become a staff and volunteer favorite! She spent her days attending events and fundraisers, relaxing in the shelter lobby with staff or sitting in the laps of her favorite volunteer. However, time just continued to pass. While she waited, Brier kept her tail wagging each and every day. We all knew the perfect family would come for her.

Some just take longer than others. That long awaited day finally arrived on September 21, 2019. Adopters Keith & Stacie walked Brier out through the shelter doors and into her new life! They have stated they are "very glad to have her as part

of the family" and that Brier is "very sweet and cuddly." Brier is adjusting well in her new life and is having the best time playing with the other dogs. Stacie even stated that Brier is "as fast around the yard" as the other dogs!

Thank you, Keith and Stacie, for adopting and giving a second chance to a dog that was in our care for almost a whole year! This dog touched so many people including clinic and shelter staff, as well as volunteers, board members, and supporters. # LETTER FROM THE CEO

## Meet Lori!

Joining AWL feels like the mix of a dream come true and a lifetime of work coming to fruition. The first because having the honor to work for the animals is something I hoped my whole career I would have the opportunity to do. The second because it has long been my career goal to find myself in the leadership role of a strong, respected organization.

I grew up in the Mahoning Valley and have spent the bulk of my life here. As a child, we always had AT LEAST one cat in the house. In my early twenties, I got my first dog, a lab mix puppy from the Mahoning County Dog Pound. Her name was Chloe, and to this day she is one of the smartest animals I ever met. You could train this dog to do anything! She spent the second half of her life with my dad. They were best friends and went everywhere together. We lost her a few years ago, and it affected not only my family but people in the community who had also come to love Chloe.

Now, I have one dog. She is a fluffy mutt named Roxie who will celebrate her tenth birthday in December. I've had her since she was a puppy when a neighbor's dog had a surprise litter (Here is your reminder to have your pets spayed or neutered). Roxie is not sure how she feels about me coming home smelling of dogs and cats everyday but she seems to be coming to terms with it.

I have been with AWL for about six month now. I have spent that time talking with our staff, volunteers, community members, and board members. I have spent my time learning as much about the history and the operations of AWL as my brain can hold. I continue to question why we do (or don't do) things to make sure we do everything because of our mission to *"Rescue, Adopt, Rehabilitate, Educate."* However, I think the most important things I have learned are: over 1,000 animals come to our shelter every year, and we do close to 800 adoptions each year.

Basic subtraction shows me that our job will never be done. It also tells me that the work we are doing is vital to our community. These dogs, cats, guinea pigs, rabbits, and all the rest need us here to protect them and to show them that people do care about them.

I have a lot more to learn. I have a lot of you still to meet. I am excited for my future here as the CEO and I am excited to see where AWL will be in five years! I think we may just surprise ourselves.

## HELPING TO KEEP PETS HAPPY AND HEALTHY IN THEIR HOMES

It has been a busy few months at AWL! In May of this year, Diane King joined the AWL team as the new Program and Outreach Director. Diane comes with many years of animal experience from both her personal pet grooming business, as well as her role in the founding and operating of Animal Pawtectors. Diane's primary role with AWL is to create and manage new and existing programs and to form partnerships across Trumbull County and beyond to help AWL better fulfill their mission. Working alongside the other staff, Diane has begun rolling out new programs to serve pet owners in the community.

AWL has supported our community for the last 50 years by taking in sick, injured, stray, and surrendered animals, but there is a need for so much more! As AWL grows, we have wondered what we can do to better serve the needs of the animals and people of Trumbull County. People fall on hard times, especially with the loss of so many jobs here in the Valley. It can become increasingly difficult to provide our pets with routine medical care, such as spay and neuter services and rabies vaccinations. It can be even more difficult to provide them with emergency medical care when an unexpected illness or trauma happens. With this in mind, we developed some programs for our community to target these needs to help animals stay in good homes and receive the care they need. Thanks to a generous donation made by Glenn & Jean Harnett, AWL has been able to develop a series of programs in their honor. These programs were designed to honor the wishes of Mr. & Mrs. Harnett by directly impacting animals in Trumbull and Mercer Counties. Through providing financial aid in emergency medical situations, offering free pet food for those facing financial difficulty, and holding quarterly low-cost rabies clinics, AWL is working to ensure the Harnett's gift makes the biggest impact possible.

The Jean Harnett Companions in Crisis program was developed in response to a need AWL witnessed every day; good pet owners in the community are being faced with pet medical emergencies requiring hundreds, even thousands, of dollars in veterinary expenses. By offering Trumbull and Mercer County residents financial assistance to help cover veterinary costs, AWL has been able to help 57 pet owners and 61 pets since the program's beginning in June of this year. This adds up to a total of almost \$17,300 with AWL covering 75% of those bills. Another program birthed from the Harnett gift to AWL is the pet food pantry. This program allows for pet owners who live or work in Trumbull County who are facing financial difficulties to receive free pet food. AWL believes that good pet owners should not have to choose between putting food on their family's table or putting food in their pet's bowl when faced with a temporary hardship. The program has restrictions on the length of time food can be provided, and the owner must agree to not take on any additional pets while receiving assistance. There is no financial qualification process for the pet food pantry. AWL also rolled out their spay and neuter program in September of this year. Unwanted animals only add to the current overpopulation crisis. However many families cannot afford the cost of



routine spay and neuter services to prevent such births. The AWL spay and neuter program targets this need in our community. Through a partnership with local veterinarian, Dr. Sue Wilcox, at Steel Valley Spay and Neuter Clinic, AWL is able to offer discounted spay and neuter services to low income families. Applicants are qualified based on income and then pay a small copay. AWL covers the remaining cost. While this program is only a few months in the making, the hope is to one day see a decrease in the number of animals entering the shelter by reducing the number of unwanted litters. As you can see, it has been a busy 2019 at AWL. We are excited for more things to come and to continue keeping pets happy and healthy in their loving homes!
