Duncan's **SECOND** Chance

In October of 2014, Animal Welfare League received a humane complaint about several dogs and puppies at an address that were being neglected. During the investigation, the dogs were found to be living outside without the standard necessities such as proper shelter. All of the dogs were eventually relinquished to Animal Welfare League and brought to the shelter for protective custody. One of these dogs would soon be renamed Duncan and would be loved by every shelter staff member and volunteer that had the pleasure of meeting him.

When he arrived, Duncan was about seven years old, thin, heartworm positive but incredibly loving! After receiving veterinary care, vaccinations, and just the right amount of TLC, Duncan began gaining weight and becoming a strong and healthy guy. He went through extensive heartworm treatment and eventually attended the Caring Companions Program for training and to gain basic obedience skills. Upon graduation in February 2015, Duncan still was not adopted. He waited patiently for the right family to come in and fall in love with him just as all of the staff and volunteers had. Duncan was eventually placed very briefly into two homes but was returned quickly because he did not like to share his toys with the other dogs in the adoptive homes. His last return was in the beginning of October 2015.

Over a year later, Pauline had finally decided that it was time for a family pet! Her young daughter, Katie, was looking online at dogs for adoption in nearby shelters and came across Duncan's picture and she thought he was the "cutest dog ever." That's when the whole family decided to come in and meet him. It didn't take but a few minutes for the whole family, including Katie's brother, Johnny, to fall in love! Pauline describes it as "love at first sight" and says that they were blessed to welcome Duncan into their family. Pauline says that Duncan is a "true gentleman" and added that he goes everywhere with her family. "You wonder sometimes if a pet can have feelings," stated Pauline. "Honestly, when we are with Duncan we know he loves us and we love him! Thank you all for taking such great care of him and saving him for us. We know this was meant to be. He is truly a member of our family." After almost two years at AWL, Duncan will soon be traveling on his first vacation to Florida with his new family and they say that they can't wait to take him to the beach!

Déjà vu is the feeling I have as I begin my last year serving as President. The AWL board has expanded to include capable and talented individuals. I am excited about the many opportunities this experienced board will have for the future of the AWL. I know you will also share in my excitement when you meet Sana Azem, the AWL Executive Director. Please welcome her to our organization! Also we congratulate Kayley Frost on her new promotion to Shelter Manager. Both of these team members have backgrounds which will help make significant contributions to the AWL organization.

As an organization grows, so does the budget which supports the AWL. We continue to need ongoing financial support for the many animal programs we promote, déjà vu.

This October, the shelter basement took on water, déjà vu. The good news is this large amount of rainfall allowed our contractors and architect to diagnose and fix the problem for the future. We are very THANKFUL to the Vienna Fire department for their help in this time of crisis. While the animal areas were not affected, the repair costs were over \$3,000, and for this, we could use your help.

The Menagerie Thrift and Gift Store has expanded to include a boutique. What a nice addition this has been for the store! The Menagerie is the life blood of the AWL. We continue to need able and willing volunteers to help process the flow of goods from the trunks of cars to the shelves of the Menagerie, déjà vu. We THANK all who donate and shop at the Menagerie; if you have not visited recently, stop in to view the boutique and say hello to Dawn as she is tackling a huge task. We have done much needed electrical and lighting repairs to the Menagerie, and many more repairs are needed. Please continue your support.

The Kent State University Veterinary Technician program continues to develop. The program leaders KSU has in place are very talented and will develop a strong curriculum for the future. Dr. Sparks continues to play a valuable role with the KSU Vet Tech program. It continues to be Doc's dream to complete the surgery and teaching facility at AWL. Well, déjà vu! While several donors have earmarked donations for this purpose, the AWL continues to seek donors to help us complete this project. Thanks to all who have helped make a future for veterinary technicians at our AWL.

The Have-A-Hart pet store has seen some growth. This retail store has much more potential, déjà vu. The Fromm pet foods are second to none in quality ingredients. December 3 was our annual Have-A-Hart Holiday Extravaganza featuring pictures with Santa. Please stop in and see the fantastic line of pet products the AWL has for purchase, the proceeds of which go directly toward our shelter animals' care.

The AWL has continued its talks with Trumbull County officials about the proposed Trumbull County Dog Pound merger. At this time, the Commissioners have deemed it not feasible to go forward with the dog pound merger with AWL, even though AWL donors have made a huge investment into the AWL shelter building for this merger to be a possibility. It is still a goal of the AWL to have one modern facility to claim a lost pet or adopt a new pet, déjà vu.

Our AWL will continue to provide care, shelter, and humane investigation for the animals. While it is true, "You cannot fix stupid," the AWL will continue to educate the community on the proper treatment and handling of animals, as well as provide the animal care and legal avenues to hold individuals accountable for their abuse of animals. The AWL continues to care for severely abused animals, déjà vu. With the passage of "Goddard's Law," a tribute to Dick Goddard who has been a champion for animals since graduating high school in 1949, knowingly causing serious physical harm to a companion animal is now a fifth degree felony on the first offense. This could include six to twelve months in prison, a \$2,500 fine, and paying for treatment and care of the animal while it is impounded.

I want to personally give each of you a heartfelt THANK YOU for your time and financial support. Without you, AWL could not make progress in our mission of "ensuring the humane treatment of animals and providing food, shelter, water and veterinary care to shelter pets." The AWL will honor your trust to continue on with our mission, déjà vu.

How did you find yourself as the Shelter Manager of AWL?

Through hard work and dedication to the animals, I soon became the Intake Manager where I oversaw the intake of approximately 13,000 animals annually as well as their basic care, medical needs, proper placement and more. I came on board with AWL in the summer of 2014 and have since been very proud to represent AWL and our mission.

What do you love most about AWL?

I also love that "Educate" is part of our mission. When you work in animal welfare and rescue, it is essential that educating the community is a priority. Whether it's as simple as teaching children how to properly approach or handle an animal or as imperative as educating the public on the need and benefits of spaying and neutering, knowledge and education is always a vital aspect of what we do daily.

She saw potential in me and offered me my first position into management of an animal shelter organization. Amy has dedicated her life to shelter animals and I was consistently amazed at her compassion and knowledge as she touched and bettered the lives of homeless animals. Amy is a true inspiration to me.

What inspires you?

I am truly inspired by my family. I was lucky enough to be raised by the most amazing parents that not only loved me unconditionally but have never stopped pushing me to work hard for what I want out of life. My parents have taught me essential life values that have helped to mold and shape me into the person I am today as well as who I hope to be in the future. I am confident in their support and know that they will never stop encouraging me.

fee is \$150 and includes his neuter, vaccinations, heartworm treatment, a microchip and more!






includes his neuter, vaccinations, FeLV & FIV testing and a microchip with registration.


