

PANDA'S SUCCESS STORY

The Animal Welfare League offers financial assistance to pet owners who are unable to pay for emergency veterinary services for their companion animals. As pet owners it can be very scary to have an emergency arise with our family companion. It can be even more scary to have that emergency arise and not have the financial means to pay for the medical cost to save your animals life. Panda, became extremely ill and her Mom reached out to the AWL in desperation for help. Panda was suffering from Pyometra, a serious and life threatening condition that must be treated quickly and aggressively. Pyometra occurs in intact female dogs and requires an emergency spay surgery to save their life.

Thanks to a generous donation from Glenn and Jean Harnett, our Companions in Crisis program was born in 2019 and leapt into action to save Panda! Panda

was taken to the vet immediately and spayed. Without this program Panda's family would have faced a difficult decision. We are happy that Panda was able to resume a normal happy life.

PEPPER'S SECOND CHANCE

Pepper received her second chance at life in March 2019. It was a cold, snowy day when AWL Humane Agents received a call about a dog that had been left behind by her owners when they moved away. It soon became apparent that Pepper had been abandoned and was left in grim condition. Pepper was curled up in a small plastic dog house surrounded in snow and wet blankets. The agents had to take their time to coax Pepper out of her house. It was shocking to see a dog in such an emaciated and weak state. Pepper was seized and brought to a local veterinary clinic for evaluation. During initial veterinary examination, Pepper weighed in at only 24 pounds.

You could easily see her ribs, spine, hip bones and even skull bones. She was dirty, her nails were overgrown and she was dehydrated. The veterinarian described it as “one of the worst cases of starvation” she had seen in a long time. Despite her condition, Pepper was bright and happy. A

A plan of action was quickly put into place. Pepper needed critical nutrition management before we could even begin to think about treating the heartworm disease. Within a few weeks of getting the necessary and per care, Pepper had gained 10 pounds. She was



thriving. We knew Pepper was going to make it but we still had to wait and hope that we would be granted custody through the court case. Pepper's previous owner had been charged with cruelty to animals.

It was a court case that lasted months. Finally, in September, the case was finalized. Pepper's previous owner was found guilty. However, Pepper was still waiting to find her forever home. Because of her past, Pepper needed a special home. She was reactive with her food and was never properly socialized with other animals. Pepper needed a family that was willing to look beyond her past and work with her in ways no one ever had. That glorious day came at Christmas. Pepper found the family she had been looking for! It was a bittersweet day to the shelter staff as Pepper walked out the door to her new life. She had become the



wagging tail we we all loved to see day after day, month after month. Through the heartache, staff knew that Pepper was finally going to experience a life she never thought possible.

Pepper's new parents, Karena and Michelle, said that it has been “so much fun watching Pepper explore her new home and become more independent.” Pepper also “loves playing ball and is the best at hide and seek.” Karena and Michelle said they are looking forward to spring when Pepper “can run and play” with them in the yard and enjoy a cookout! IRA DISTRIBUTIONS

An individual age 70 ½ or older may distribute up to \$100,000 tax-free from his or her individual retirement accounts (IRAs) to certain charitable organization without including the distribution in gross income. A qualified charitable distribution must be made directly by a trustee to a 50-percent organization, but not to a supporting organization otherwise be deductible as even though the individual consult with your finance or a donor advised fund. The entire distribution must a charitable donation, disregarding the percentage limitations, cannot claim a charitable deduction for a donation. Please professional regarding your specific IRA disbursement.
