
2022 BY THE NUMBERS

Last year was a huge year around AWL in all aspects. We had a record-breaking year for intakes, adoptions, and transfers!

Animal intakes into the shelter were 1,645. That is a 61% increase over our 2020 intake of 1,022. Of those animals, 942 came in through our amazing humane department, a 150% increase over our 2020 number of 377. As you can imagine, the majority of the animals coming to AWL are dogs and cats. However, in 2022 we also took in fish, rats, snakes, bearded dragons, and tegus. Just to name a few.

The team at AWL did 1,040 adoptions (up from 860 in 2021), returned 40 lost animals to their owners, and transferred 176 animals to regional rescues and shelters. Our Humane Agents successfully prosecuted 15 cases of animal cruelty and neglect in 2022 with dozens of additional charges pending into 2023. This makes a three-year 100% success rate for our Humane Department in the Trumbull County Court system ensure those that neglect and abuse animals see some level of punishment.

None of this would be possible without our amazing staff and our supporters. Our team is here, in the field rescuing the abandoned, neglected and abused. They are caring for the sick and injured. Being patient with the scared and shut down. You all are here by sharing our stories, providing financial support, and donations of food and other supplies. Thank you. For what you have done and for your continued support as we work on behalf of all of the animals in Trumbull County and beyond.

HUMANE DEPARTMENT UPDATE

Success for Turkey

Turkey, lovingly named for the turkey sound she made when left alone in any room, came to AWL through our Humane Department in December of 2021. Humane Agents were performing a routine follow up check on Downs Road in Warren, Ohio when they found the 10-year-old Chihuahua in an alarming state. During a previous visit to the property the owner was instructed to take the dog to the vet to get treatment for fleas and minor hair loss. It was quickly apparent the owner did not follow the orders of our agents and the dog had declined very rapidly.

Turkey had extreme hair loss over 100% of her body and was bald over 70% of that area. She was also underweight. There were multiple open wounds and red, irritated skin showing signs of infection. Her nails were extremely overgrown and live fleas could be seen crawling on her already inflamed skin. Humane Agents removed the dog from the property immediately and transported her to receive veterinary care. After examining Turkey, the veterinarian stated, "testing revealed a severe bacterial skin and ear infection. Without treatment, this severe infection causes suffering and poor quality of life. [Turkey's] nails were very overgrown and impeded her ability to walk normally."

AWL staff took the senior lady under their wings. Performing the prescribed medicated baths, making sure she had an assortment of sweaters and hoodies to keep her warm while her hair regrew, and plenty of treats and love. A few weeks later it was decided the best route for Turkey was to transfer to one of our partner rescues, Animal Pawtectors, to be placed in a foster home while she healed and gained back some confidence. It just so happens, that foster fell in love and has her to this day.

Turkey now goes by Edith and her adopters can't say enough good about her. "She's a wonderful, happy, furry girl these days!" Edie has many kitty friends including "her" 2 kittens, Lucy and CinderElla. She also has some bunny friends whom she loves to sniff and give little licks. Edie insists on sleeping under the covers and prefers the comfort of the electric blanket. She will give any big dog a run for their money when it comes to snoring. Her adopters went on to say, "it took a lot of vet care, love, and patience but she's such a different dog. Her health is great and her confidence is so much better. She doesn't make her turkey howl anymore when we are out of her sight. She just hangs with the cats and naps until we walk back in."





Edie's former owner pleaded guilty to cruelty and neglect of a companion animal. They received 90 days in jail, all suspended with the successful completion of five years of probation. They may not live with, own or possess additional animals during those five years.







Foster Season Has Sprung!

Although it seems like the warm weather will never return to Ohio, Spring is just around the corner, as is foster season. Fostering is when you temporarily house and care for animal(s) that are too young, too small, or too weak to be adopted into their "furever" homes. For kittens to be fixed (before being adopted) they need to be at least 8 weeks old and 2 pounds. During kitten season, kittens under this age and/or weight may enter AWL's care and won't be eligible for adoption for several more weeks.

According to the ASPCA (2018), tiny kittens are the most vulnerable during this time because of their weak immune systems, so they need as much attention and care as possible. It's also good for kittens to get plenty of attention so that they're properly socialized when adopters come looking for a new addition to their family. Fostering is incredibly important because it gives these tiny animals a better chance at survival and home placement.

Shelters are typically swarmed with calls starting in the Spring and extending into late Summer from people who find abandoned kittens, pregnant cats, etc. There are approximately 3.2 million kittens entering shelters across the country during this time, and upwards of 860,000 are euthanized because some shelters don't have the resources necessary to care for these tiny kittens (ASPCA, 2018).

Depending on the animal's age, fostering will entail time and flexibility, as very tiny animals will need to be cleaned and bottle-fed formula unless momma is still with the litter. For older animals, fostering may include providing different stages of food in addition to giving them plenty of love and attention. The important thing is to keep them healthy and happy while keeping a close eye on their progress to ensure they're growing.

Fosters need to be kept separate from any other pets in your home, and hand washing before and after handling fosters is vital to keeping all the animals in your home as healthy as possible.

You could be a great foster.

If you're interested in fostering with a shelter such as AWL, you can ask for a foster application which the shelter will use to determine if you'd be a match for the process. If it's a match, you'll be contacted when the shelter has an animal(s) in the situation you've expressed comfort with. For example, if you're okay with having a momma cat with her kittens in your home, when a momma and babies are available for fostering, the shelter can contact you to see if you're available to foster them.

Once the animal(s) meet the age and weight requirements to go back to the shelter, they will be spayed/neutered, given all their vaccines, etc. Then, they go up for adoption and find loving homes.

I began fostering kittens for AWL in April 2022. I am a huge cat-lover and it was very important to me and my husband to be a part of the solution by opening our home to fostering. Alex and I fostered a total of 12 kittens that were adopted out through AWL last year. Some came to us with their momma, others were all alone and needed bottle-fed, and some were

already weaned and just needed a place to call home for a few weeks.

We loved every single one of them and always got attached. But I remember that when we adopted our cat Potter from New Lease on Life Rescue in Struthers at 8 weeks old, it was evident he'd been loved by a foster family until he found his loving "furever" home with us, and that gives me the reassurance to know every kitten we fostered has a loving home like ours and that we made a meaningful difference in that one's life.

People always tell me "I could never do that" when they learn that we foster, and I used to think the same thing. It is very difficult to part ways with an animal you have cared for and loved. But it is so rewarding and worthwhile to know how loved they'll be. You can do it, and there is so much support out there, especially when fostering through AWL, to get you through it.

Fostering is the most fulfilling part of my life and I wouldn't give it up for anything.

If you can't foster but still want to support fosters, the shelter can greatly benefit from donations such as dry kitten food (Purina Kitten Chow) as well as kitten formula "KMR" (kitten milk replacer) which you can find at Chewy, Walmart, Petsmart, etc.

Pomegranate welcomed into his new home!

Pomegranate came to AWL through our humane department in October of 2022. His appearance was alarming to say the least but he seemed active. After a trip to the exotic veterinarian it was confirmed what AWL staff suspected. Pomegranate had skeletal abnormalities likely caused by metabolic bone disease (MBD). However, he isn't in pain and doesn't have any mobility issues – he just looks funky! MBD is related to improper keeping, including diet and lighting. About a month later, Pomegranate was adopted by Ben and Cheryl of Cuyahoga Falls. Here is what they had to say about their experience adopting a special needs reptile.

"Pomegranate seems to have adapted quite well to his new home. He has a very modest habitat, as he has some trouble getting around, but he is also moving around more and more each day! He has a log he loves to climb on and under, and a nice big flat rock. When I first got him we kept an eye on him a lot, and offered him a special recipe liquid diet along with dubia roaches. Now, he seems more apt to hunt, but I still make sure to give him a lot of the stuff he needs that he missed out on, which led to why he looks the way he did when he was adopted.

The adoption experience was great. Unfortunately, I did have to drive to the shelter twice and I live an hour away. Other than that it was easy!

We originally saw Pomegranate's adoption post on Instagram and were very excited to meet him! We had no reservations about adopting Pomegranate knowing full well from the pictures and our initial meeting that he was special needs. It's very unfortunate that Pomegranate got this condition. I don't think many people are aware just how many reptiles suffer similar fates. Pet stores sell lots of things that are marketed for bearded dragons that aren't good, and can even be harmful to them. People don't do proper research since bearded dragons are marketed often as a beginner pet. Some people act surprised they require veterinary visits.

Pomegranate's picture just called out to us -- I could tell he was an excellent dragon that just needed a loving home and



someone willing to spend a little extra time with him. What made us want to adopt him most is that we follow a lot of reptiles on Instagram and have a lot of friends who have also ended up caring for a special needs reptile. We have another bearded dragon someone offered us when its owners simply didn't want her anymore. She actually was very well taken care of and healthy.

Pomegranate may be...well, weird looking, crinkly, but he has more personality than most. He will hold onto you and has the most beautiful dragon eyes you ever saw. He is still very skinny but has started to put on a little weight, and we hope he is with us for a very long time.

We also hope Pomegranate can help raise awareness that reptiles are not just disposable pets or beginner pets, and that bearded dragons require more than just one light bulb and crickets. Pomegranate is a good ambassador for reminding us of the importance of properly caring for reptiles and other exotic pets. If you are considering adopting any pet, please do your homework before making the commitment. The AWL staff is happy to help you choose the best pet for your lifestyle!
